# Lands Being Alienated or Discontinued

### 1. OVERALL CHARACTER OF THE PARKLANDS.

a) Are the lands currently used for park purposes? If not, how are they used?

Currently, there is a small playground in a 3-sided fenced-in area next to 225 South Allen Street, utilizing a small portion of the 2+ acres for park purposes. The playground contains 4 swings (2 baby/2 kid), a tire swing and a picnic table. The remaining lands are deeply wooded and overgrown. From the sidewalk on South Allen Street, the woods slope down to wet land that does not appear suitable for a park, unless a footbridge or boardwalk was built for crossing. The wooded area extends back to Onderdonk Avenue, a dead end street that runs parallel to South Allen Street.

Do they appear to have been used for park purposes in the past?

The playground area is/has been used for park purposes. It does not appear that the remaining wooded area has ever been used for park purposes.

Are they suitable for use for park and/or recreational purposes?

The playground is still in tact. The condition is good except for a crack in the front of one baby swing (see photo) and the lawn area needs to be mowed. The wooded area would take quite a bit of work to create trails or clear brush to use for park and/or recreational purposes.

If the playground is removed, the families in nearby apartments would probably have to drive to other sites for a similar experience. The wooded area is overgrown and does not appear to be utilized by the community.

# 4. AFFECT ON REMAINING PARKLANDS

a) How will any remaining parklands be affected by the alienation? Will there still be a viable park serving the same constituency?

If the wooded area is developed into apartments, the playground would no longer be surrounded by woods which provide a quiet, natural background.

b) What public park resources or recreational facilities are available to residents of the community to take the place of any being alienated?

If the playground is lost due to the development of apartments, the following three parks may provide a similar experience based upon a search in Google maps (Note: we did <u>not</u> visit these parks):

- Distance: .8 miles from South Allen Street Playground

- 3. Distance: **1.3 miles** from South Allen Street Playground

  <u>Buckingham Lake Park</u> (Berkshire Blvd & Colonial Ave) according to the City of Albany's list, this park contains a playground and offers ice skating.




